Resisting the enemy's attack

Proverbs 24:6 For by wise counsel you will wage your own war, and in a multitude of counselors *there is* safety.

Ingenuity: good strategy (=intelligence) intellectual capacity to quickly provide a solution to a problem or question

Ephesians 4:27 nor give place to the devil.

- Place: (Greek) topos. It has to do with topography. Territory. Location. Access point and point of entry.
- If the devil is defeated, dethroned, and destroyed. Why does he attack us?
- Devil is diabolos and means: "He who strikes repeatedly until he successfully penetrates an object to ruin it, affect it and take it captive."
- He who controls your mind controls your life.

5 words that describe how the devil works:

- 1. Snares
- 2. Schemes
- 3. Strongholds
- 4. Oppression
- 5. Deception

1. Snares

Ephesians 6:11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

- Snare: A method of making a path. An avenue of attack. This avenue leads to your mind. action of spying or threatening a person.
- The devil's method is to attack your mind.

2. Schemes

2 Corinthians 2:11 (NET) so that we may not be exploited by Satan (for we are not ignorant of his schemes).

• Schemes: noema means brain, mind. Deranged, disturbed, modified, twisted mind.

3. Stronghold

- He wants to make a nest in your mind.
- Stronghold is a prison. A castle.
- Prison is so you do not come out.
- The castle is so that no one can enter.

2 Corinthians 10:3-5

For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. ⁴For the weapons of our warfare *are* not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, ⁵ casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ,

- Captive: Taking a captive prisoner at swordpoint.
- The devil builds a road.

4. **Oppression**

Acts 10:38

how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

- Depression: it can be due to natural causes, but it can also be spiritual. Chemical imbalance.
- Oppression: is demonic. Katadunasteuo (gr.) Kata means to dominate, to subjugate. Dunamis power. A power that oppresses your mind. It subjugates you.
- The ultimate goal is to deceive you. Deception is a trap.

Example: lenses of deception.

• The devil uses reinforcements. Thoughts bring reinforcements.

Example: Balls - illustrating how the devil beats you.

Example: A sword.

How do I resist the enemy's attack?

1. Submit to God

James 4:7 Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you.

Submit (hupotas so) Someone who is submitted to some type of authority. Hide behind someone's back.

Illustration: The wife protects herself behind her husband.

Resist: oppose against someone. Stand against.

The Battle of the Mind

Isaiah 26:3 (NKJV)

You will keep *him* in perfect peace, *whose* mind *is* stayed *on You*, Because he trusts in You.

Mark 12:30 (NKJV)

And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This *is* the first commandment.

• This is a priority of having our minds aligned with that of Christ.

- The success or failure of your life will be determined in the battle of your mind.
- The biggest enemy is you.
- Judge your mind: Do you have peace, joy, faith. Or anxiety, sadness, doubt.
- Your thoughts determine your attitude.
- When you change your thoughts, you change your life.
- In your mind there may be worried, fear, anger, doubt. O love, joy, peace, and hope
- The person who is always worried is destined to fail.

• Your worry is saying that you do not have confidence that God can take care of you.

<u>What is attitude?</u> Attitude is a feeling from within expressed by behavior from the outside.

- Attitude is what is in your mind.
- Your mind is filled with faith, or it is filled with doubt.
- Your mind is your best friend or your worst enemy.
- What is in your mind is going to bring people closer or push them away.
- There is no victory without a fight.
- There is no sun without a night.
- There is no purchase without a price.
- There is no crown without a cross.
- You cannot change what you do not confront.

Your success is linked to your mind!
